## **UNIVERSITY COMMITTEE STUDENT REPRESENTATION OPPORTUNITIES MARQUETTE UNIVERSITY STUDENT GOVERNMENT**

**ACADEMIC TECHNOLOGY ADVISORY COMMITTEE** (2 students) provides a formal method of input and feedback from academic units regarding technology and promotes optimal integration of technology into academic operations. It ensures that the academic technology needs are considered, including emerging technologies and replacement of existing systems when necessary. It provides a voice for improving services to meet the technology needs for the faculty and students.

**ALUMNI MEMORIAL UNION ADVISORY BOARD** (4 students) recommends and reviews policies and programs for the AMU to complement the educational goals of Marquette University and provide opportunities for the cultural, social, educational, and recreational pursuits of members of Marquette.

**BOARD FOR STUDENT MEDIA** (2 students) is a subcommittee of the Academic Senate that oversees Marquette University's student media. These include the *Marquette Tribune*, *Marquette Journal*, Marquette Radio, MUTV, Student Interactive Media and any future ventures conducted under the direction of Student Media.

**BOARD OF UNDERGRADUATE STUDIES** (2 students) is a standing committee of the Academic Senate. The Board addresses undergraduate educational affairs that affect more than one college, school, or program and serves as a forum for the discussion of the development, coordination, integration and improvement of all undergraduate education.

**COMMITTEE ON TEACHING** (1 student) is a committee of the Academic Division that reports to the Academic Senate and the Provost. The committee addresses and advances the practice and scholarship of teaching and learning at Marquette University.

**CORE CURRICULUM REVIEW COMMITTEE** (1 student) is responsible for supervising the implementation and direction of the new "core" of common studies. This includes reviewing proposals for core courses and other procedural issues.

**FINANCIAL AID COMMITTEE** (2 students) is responsible for the formulation of policy in the area of scholarship and financial aid by reviewing student scholarship appeals, judging Continuing Student Scholarship Competition, and advising the Office of Student Financial Aid.

**LANDLORD TENANT COUNCIL** (6+ students) strives to improve communication between property owners and students in the Marquette neighborhood by offering dispute resolution alternatives and maximizing city resources.

**LATE NIGHT MARQUETTE STEERING COMMITTEE** (2 students) is responsible for the overall direction of the Late Night Marquette program. It serves as an advisory group and is responsible for finance and budgeting, assessment, and program direction.

**LIBRARY BOARD** (1 student) serves as an advisory body to the Dean of Libraries. Its primary responsibility is the consideration of library matters insofar as they affect the teaching, research, and learning environment for faculty and students.

**MANRESA PROJECT ADVISORY BOARD** (2 students) advises the Manresa Project in its efforts to form Christian leaders on campus in accord with the University's mission.

**MARQUETTE INTERCHANGE COMMITTEE** (2 students) evaluates the effects of the project on the Marquette community, identifies possible areas of improvement, and handles any concerns with the project.

**MISSION WEEK PLANNING COMMITTEE** (2 students) plans the University's annual Mission Week, during which the campus celebrates and reclaims its Jesuit, Ignatian heritage.

**PARKING COMMITTEE** (2 students – 1 commuter, 1 residential) serves to advise the Office of Parking Services on parking policies.

**RECREATIONAL SPORTS ADVISORY BOARD** (2 students) provides recommendations and support to the Department of Recreational Sports and for the activities and operation of the Rec Center and Rec Plex.

**RENEWAL TASK FORCE** (2 students) looks for ways to improve quality and reduce administrative costs by reallocating resources to improve student services, fund deferred maintenance, investment in technology, and improve employee salaries.

**SAFETY COMMITTEE** (4 students – one for each class) reviews policies and procedures and provides recommendations designed to provide a safe environment on campus.

**STUDENT ORGANIZATION POLICY ADVISORY COMMITTEE** (2 students) provides advice to the Office of Student Development on policies and procedures related to recognized student organizations.

**UNIVERSITY ACADEMIC SENATE** (1 student) is a deliberative body which is responsible for academic policy formulation and the review of academic programs. The Senate is comprised of faculty representatives and two student representatives. The University Provost chairs the monthly meetings.

**UNIVERSITY APPEALS COMMITTEE** (Up to 4 students) is responsible for considering appeals of Departmental or University disciplinary actions.

**UNIVERSITY ATHLETICS BOARD** (1 student) serves as an advisory body to formulate and recommend athletic policy in a variety of areas.

**UNIVERSITY BUDGET COMMITTEE** (1 student) advises the President in the formation of a balanced annual operating budget. *An interview or supplemental application may be requested at a later date.*

**UNIVERSITY HONORS COMMITTEE** (1 student) reviews and evaluates nominations for honorary degrees which are solicited each year from the Marquette University community.

**UNIVERSITY MISSION COUNCIL** (2 students) advises the Office of University Mission and Identity with regard to the advancement and implementation of Marquette's mission. Program review and mission integration are the focus. Members also engage in long-range planning for the Office of Mission and Identity.

**VENDOR COMMITTEE** (4 students) serves in an advisory role to oversee the operation of the University's vendors and handle any concerns.
